BACK TO SCHOOL GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

AUTHORIZED PICK-UPS & REGISTRATION FORMS

It is essential that all pertinent information on your child's card be kept up to date! Remember that we cannot release your child to any person who has not been designated by you on the registration form in writing. The names of persons designated to pick up your child must be in your own handwriting. If we have not met this person we will ask for identification. No exceptions will be made!

BIRTHDAYS IN SCHOOL

Children enjoy sharing an uncomplicated birthday snack with their school classmates. For best results keep it simple! Please remember, gifts for the birthday child are inappropriate at preschool and we ask that you please do not bring "goodie bags" for the children.

If you are planning a "home birthday party" we will be glad to pass on the invitations via the lunch box mailbox, only if all children on the classroom list are invited. Otherwise, we ask that the invitation be mailed to the child's parent.

[CALENDAR & NEWSLETTER](#)

You will receive a year's calendar in July, which is a revision of the Dade County Public School Calendar. We follow the latter as closely as possible with a few exceptions. Early each month you will receive a newsletter, which will also keep you up on events and dates of special happenings. Please post it where it can be read.

[CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS FOR FAMILY AND FRIENDS](#)

It is our custom to have a program with the children around holidays and other special times. It is not our philosophy to put pressure on children to "perform" for parents. We like to "share" the things they've been singing and learning all year. This "sharing" must be a relaxed, low-keyed time in a pleasant atmosphere. Please be aware that your child may or may not wish to participate on this day in your presence. This is a normal reaction for preschool age children and we feel it is totally acceptable.

We enjoy special event days such as Halloween, Hispanic Heritage Day, Pilgrim Day, Pow-Wow, La Posada, Kwanzaa, Circus Day, Olympic Day, and America Day. Look for these special days written in the newsletters. All the classes come together for these special events around 9:30 or so. Remember that these are not "performances" for parents but occasions to learn and share a social experience for the whole school regardless of age. Parents are usually invited to observe and take pictures if they so choose.

We always welcome an opportunity to have a special day for the country of your family's origin, an "International Cultural Sharing Day". If you would be interested in sharing your heritage with the children we would be appreciative and help in any way we can. Please see Mrs. Watson.

CLOTHING AND SHOES

Remember that your child may get dirty during play or art time, so please send them to school in simple play clothes that you can easily wash. Your child's cubby in the classroom should have a bag containing extra clothing for a quick change. Be sure to have your child's name printed clearly on any items that they bring to school. This is especially important for coats and sweaters.

Non-slip athletic shoes suitable for running and climbing are imperative. Sandals, open-toed shoes and long dresses are dangerous for children on the playground and will not be allowed!

Belts and any other tight clothing make it very difficult for children to be independent in the bathroom. Make sure clothing is loose fitting enough to help a child become self-sufficient and build self-esteem. **If your child is still in diapers, we ask that you do not send them in clothing that makes it hard to change them – overalls, belted pants, etc.**

Children love to dress up in imaginative costumes, which we encourage. Please check to see that they are playground safe.

CONFERENCES AND OUR "OPEN DOOR" POLICY

Open communication between parents and school is so important to your child's success and happiness. Parents are always welcome to drop in to visit and observe. Please remember that a very brief classroom visit is best for a child who is having difficulty separating from parents. Parents are welcome to come to the classroom so often at our school that there are many opportunities for conversation with the teachers. Please note that while school is in session a teacher must give full time and attention to the children and would not be able to confer with parents for any lengthy discussion. This is especially true at dismissal time at 11:45 each day.

You will receive two written reports each year about your child's progress and an opportunity to have a conference with the teacher. If at any time you have concerns about your child and wish an additional conference about your child's school experience, please make an appointment with their teacher.

DAILY ROUTINE & EXTENDED CARE

- **Drop-Off:** Teachers will be prepared to receive their children at 8:45. Before that time, the playground is open to all children who are being supervised by their parents. At 8:45, children in the 2's, 2T's, 3's and 3T's classes must be escorted to their classrooms. At 8:45, only the Pre-K4 class remains on the playground. Parents and caregivers are free to leave knowing that their children will be supervised by their teachers. A bell is rung at 9:00 to signal their return to the classroom.

It is imperative that all children be signed in at their classroom. A sign-in sheet is in the classroom and must be signed in and out daily!

- **Pre-Care:** If you wish to drop your child off early, Pre-care is available every day, with no prior notice necessary. Early arrivals will be supervised in Room #2 from 8:00 to 8:45, at which time they will be escorted to their regular classroom. A nominal fee is charged for this service and will be added to your account at the end of the month automatically.
- **Pick-Up:** Dismissal is promptly at 11:45 each day. Pre-K4 children are to be picked up before 1:00. If you are late your child will be taken to the AFTERCARE room and you will be charged for aftercare on that day. Remember that only authorized people will be allowed to take your child and that they must sign them out on the Sign Out sheet at the door with the exact time noted.

- **Aftercare:** Aftercare is available until 3:00 PM every day on a per diem basis. (Children in the 2's and 2T's are encouraged to stay only until 2:00 PM) Aftercare time is a chance for children to extend their day playing with friends and is often an intentional choice for parents. Aftercare is also a safety net for parents when unforeseen events make it important to have extended time. Parents can be assured that their children are well taken care of and having a happy experience in "aftercare". Charges are set per hour or part thereof and will be charged to your account at the end of the month automatically. If you know in the morning that you will be using this service, we ask that you let the teacher know. Don't forget to put extra food in your child's lunch box if they will be staying for aftercare. If something arises during the day and you expect to be late and wish your child to stay for aftercare, you need only call the office and we will arrange it.
- **Enrichment Classes:** Special classes are offered each day of the week during the aftercare hours, usually beginning around 12:30. They include Spanish, Music & Movement and Cooking, which are all taught by our own teachers. Ballet is also offered by an outside contractor. You will receive information early in the school year about these classes. Enrollment is open throughout the year as space is available. Payment for these programs is not included in tuition. As an outside contractor, Ballet-At-Your-School requests that payments be made directly to them. Charges for in-house enrichments will be added to your bill on a monthly basis. *Note- On days of enrichment programs you may wish to sign your child up for AFTERCARE or you may pick them up at 11:45 and return later for the class. If you use AFTERCARE you will be charged for only one hour when an enrichment program is attended and your child is picked up by 2:00 PM.

DISCIPLINE AT ECC

We believe that positive reinforcement, teaching appropriate behaviors,

good

classroom management and a calm, loving atmosphere are essential ingredients to help children establish inner controls and enable them to socialize in positive ways. Aggressive behaviors, which are hurtful and disruptive, are handled with care. A short "time out" period in which a child can regain control is helpful. Persistent aggression by the child will lead to a parent/teacher conference. We feel it is important to keep lines of communication open between preschool and family. A cooperative, loving effort will build your child's trust of the preschool experience and make a difference.

The biting behavior of a two-year-old child is considered normal but dangerous. If aggressive behaviors such as biting or hitting persist after cooperative efforts by parents and teachers to guide the child have failed, further consultation will be necessary. It may be wise to remove the child from preschool for a time and return when they are more developed and ready for the social experience.

[ECC PARENTS ASSOCIATION](#)

We invite you to participate and actively support your child's school. The functions of the group are to help preserve the preschool and its philosophy, to uphold existing policies, to assist and advise, as well as to help innovate new programs.

Members include parents, Preschool staff and Church representatives who serve as a liaison between the Church and Preschool. Issues include personnel, technology, property, program, public relations as well as special fundraising and family events. The ECC PARENTS ASSOCIATION meets regularly throughout the year. This is a wonderful support group for our preschool and a great way to meet other parents. Everyone is invited to attend.

[EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSING](#)

In the event of a community emergency such as a hurricane, or flood we will follow the policy set by the Miami-Dade County Public School System. Please listen to your radio or television news station for school closings. The Early Childhood Center may not be listed individually, but you will know that if the public schools are closed, due to a major weather event, we will also be

closed.

We will open as soon as possible. Keep in mind that due to extended power outages we may open earlier or later than the Public School System. Please be sure that all of your phone contacts are up to date so that we can contact you. Call the school office for updated messages.

[FIELD TRIPS & IN-HOUSE PROGRAMS](#)

It is not our policy to take 2 and 3 year old children on field trips by car or bus. Occasionally this age group will take a supervised walk across the street to the Church or Church garden.

The 3T and Pre-K4 children occasionally take field trips by chartered bus companies with licensed chauffeurs. Field trips are scheduled and printed in the newsletter, which you will receive monthly. Occasional walks from school grounds to the Church are covered by the permission slip you signed at registration. If your child is eligible for an off-campus field trip, you will be notified in advance and asked to sign a permission slip specific to that event.

It is our preference, in lieu of field trips, to have community resources come to us and to conduct our own in house programs. Look for these special events in our newsletters. If events are planned on a day that your child does not regularly attend you may wish to bring him just for the program and then take him home after.

[FIRE DRILLS](#)

We have monthly fire drills with all classes to teach the importance of a smooth, calm exit from the school in case of fire. Each classroom is equipped with a proper fire extinguisher and inspected yearly. Electric smoke alarms have been installed school-wide. This is a "smoke free environment". Please refrain from smoking on school grounds.

[HEALTH – IMMUNIZATION & DCF REQUIREMENTS](#)

The law requires that you must submit health form DH 3040 and immunization form DH 680 before entry to school. Both forms must be complete for your child and presented at the time of enrollment. No child will be admitted to Preschool without them. We will notify you if the forms need to be updated during the school year.

❖ **DCF Requirements – "THE BLUE SHEET"**

We have combined all of our other requirements into one "blue sheet" which you must read and sign in 5 places. The "blue sheet" includes: the reading of the discipline policy, the alternate nutrition plan in which you agree to provide nutritional foods for your child at snack time, and your signature attesting that you have read the DCF document #175-24, "Know Your Child's Day Care Center." It also includes the field trip permission form and acknowledgment of your receipt of this Parent Handbook.

ILLNESS & INJURY

If your child shows symptoms of a communicable disease such as diarrhea, irritated eyes, fever, rash, runny nose, head lice, or other signs of an infectious disease, please notify the office and keep your child at home for the appropriate isolation time. If your child should develop these symptoms at school you will be called to come and take your child home.

We appreciate your calling the office to inform us when your child is ill and will not be attending school. We will attempt to contact you to inquire about a child who has been absent more than two days. While we miss your children, we appreciate that it is important that they remain at home for the duration of their illness.

It is imperative for the safety of your child that we are informed of any significant injury the child may sustain away from school. Children often fall and receive bumps to the head. We need to know when this occurs so that we may monitor your child a little more closely.

We reserve the right to ask for a medical release for your child to return to school if they are recovering from an infectious disease or have sustained an

injury that would curtail their activities at ECC.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

In the event of a medical emergency, Fire/Rescue 911 will be called and if necessary will transport your child to the appropriate facility. Every effort would be made to contact the parents immediately. Please be sure to update your registration card in the office whenever there are changes in your contact numbers.

SAFETY AT THE PRESCHOOL

Parking Lot Safety:

It is important that you park your car in the Church parking lot or in a safe area on the swale and walk your child to the classroom to be received by a teacher. Do not park in or around the intersection, in the walkway of the school or double park on the street. Never, ever, ever leave your car's engine running while escorting your child to class or leave other children alone in the car!

Enter and exit the parking lot with caution to avoid meeting by accident. Use extreme caution when backing up. Remember that in vans and SUV's, it is difficult to see small children from your rear view mirror.

Exit and Entrance Safety:

ALWAYS BE SURE TO CLOSE AND LATCH BOTH GATES! Hold your child's hand when leaving. Do not allow your child or car pool children to run ahead of you! We always try to have someone at the gate to assist you both at the opening of school and at dismissal. The gate by the office is the only gate for entering and exiting.

Playground Safety:

There are specific playground rules, which will be posted on the bulletin board and sent home with the newsletter in the beginning of school, which will make your child's time on the playground safer and happier. At dismissal you are responsible for your own child and those in your carpool. The safety rules apply for anytime your child is on the playground before, during, and after school. Parents, the playground should be empty at 9:00 AM and again at 12:15 PM to accommodate our classroom playground schedule.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

There are specific guidelines for scholarships and financial aid that are available on request.

SNACKS

Children bring their own snacks each day in a bag or lunch box for mid morning nourishment. Please be sure to have your child's name printed clearly on the outside of their lunch box.

Reminder: ***No sodas or glass.*** Please be aware of items, which might possibly be causes for choking, such as hot dogs, small plastic tops, grapes and raw vegetable shapes. Raw vegetables are good but please cut them in thin strips and not in circular chunks.

Please avoid sugary snacks, candy, chocolate, and gummy fruit snacks. Choose nutritional items such as cheese, bread, crackers, diluted fruit juices, apple slices, bananas, etc. Remember that snacks high in protein and complex carbohydrates will sustain your child's blood sugar levels better than those high

in sugar, fat and salt.

If your child eats a full healthy breakfast then a light snack is in order. If not then you may want to include a sandwich or something more substantial. Uneaten food, if any, will come home in your child's lunch box. This may help you gauge what and how much your child will want for snack time. If your child will be staying for aftercare don't forget to add enough food to their box for lunch.

The staff is here to assist your child with snack but remember that packing foods, which your child can open and handle with ease, will promote self-esteem and self-reliance, one of the main goals for our children.

Don't forget to sanitize your child's lunch box regularly. Hard plastic boxes that can be immersed in hot soapy water or run through the dishwasher are best. Be aware that children frequently spill juice and food in their boxes. Soft-sided, covered foam bags easily absorb liquids that are spilled in them and are very hard to keep clean over time.

TUITION PAYMENTS

The year's tuition is broken down into 10 equal increments, in order to arrive at a standard monthly fee. (The amount you pay each month is not reflective of the number of days in that particular month but represents 10 percent of the yearly total cost.) Each increment is due on the 15th of the month starting with July. The last payment of the school year is due on April 15.

Checks may be made out to: EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER (or ECC)). Payments may be brought to the office (we always enjoy the chance to see you) or they may be mailed to us at 3010 DeSoto Boulevard, Coral Gables, Florida, 33134.

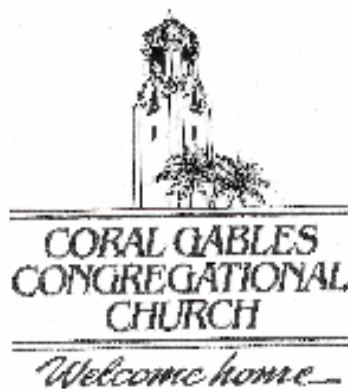
